

DIRECTOR OF CURRICULUM INTERNATIONALIZATION,
Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI)

The Director will develop, facilitate and nurture international curricular initiatives across all schools and programs at IUPUI. The Director will be part of the central Office of International Affairs, report directly to the Associate Dean of International Programs, and work closely with the Director of Study Abroad. The Director will work with faculty, departments, and other staff of the Office of International Affairs to internationalize courses and develop international learning objectives across IUPUI's broad range of schools and degree programs, to prepare faculty for international teaching, and to stimulate co-curricular international learning activities. The Director will also explore the use of interactive videoconferencing and other forms of IT for international learning, work with partner universities overseas to develop collaborative courses and curricular activities, work with University College to develop international courses for Honors and first-year students, collaborate with the Office of Professional Development on faculty workshops, and occasionally develop and teach innovative new international courses as models for the university. Adjunct faculty status is a possibility for qualified applicants.

IUPUI is a large, public, research university with 20 distinct schools and special strengths in the health and life sciences, programs for first-year students, institutional assessment, and civic engagement. It constitutes the fully merged urban campuses of both Indiana University and Purdue University, based in the capital city and economic, political, and demographic center of the state. IUPUI's strong commitment to internationalization is shaped by three central beliefs: that internationalization should cut across all academic disciplines, that it should reach all students, and that dialogue, exchange, and partnerships should be its driving force.

Applicants may come from any academic field, but must have pursued an international emphasis within it. Preference will be given to applicants holding a doctorate or other appropriate terminal degree. Preference will also be given to those with significant overseas experience, at least four years in curriculum development or international educational endeavors, at least 3 years in teaching, and familiarity with distance education.
