LU student named Fulbright Scholar

Lawrence University senior Ben Hane has been named a 2006-07 Fulbright Scholar by the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board.

The fellowship will provide Hane with a 10-month opportunity to teach English at the high school/ vocational school level in Germany starting in September.

Hane is a German and history major from East Dundee, Ill.

The Fulbright Program was created by Congress in 1946 to foster mutual understanding among nations through educational and cultural exchanges. Since its founding, the Fulbright Program has become the U.S. government's premier scholarship program, supporting more than 265,000 American students in opportunities for study, research and international training in more than 150 countries. Thirty-five Fulbright alumni have gone on to earn Nobel Prizes.

Andrea Frederick of Appleton has completed requirements for Girl Scouting's top achievement, the Girl Scout Gold Award. She receives the award at a ceremony Sunday at the Girl Scout Program Center, Appleton.

Frederick, a Girl Scout of 12 years, is a junior at Appleton East High School, Her advisor for the Gold Award was LuAnn Lundin.
