

## 2) Information for your Specific Grant Category

### Student Grantees

#### Just to remind you:

- 1) *International Office (Akademisches Auslandsamt)*  
During the first few days in your university town, and before the beginning of the semester, you should report to the *International Office* (or the Sekretariat). We trust that you have made that contact and received information on your student status (matriculation) through that office already.
- 2) *University Admission*  
We assume that you have completed your matriculation by now. If you have problems, please contact us for assistance.

**IMPORTANT: all student grantees (full and travel grantees) are required to send us proof of their matriculation. A copy of your student ID suffices. Please do this no later than November 13, 2009.**

- 3) *Proof of Academic Achievement (Scheine)*  
Please remember that you need to ask your professors/instructors for graded *Scheine*, which we request that you send us copies of at the end of each semester.

Doctoral candidates (ABD-status, full-maintenance grants) with Graduate Fellowship status should discuss their projects with a professor so that this professor can write a short progress report (*Gutachten*) at the end of the grant period.

- 4) Those grantees who participated in the Marburg language course are herewith asked to submit the enclosed report form back to us by November 13, 2009.

### Additional Programs for Interested Grantees

- 1) Internship Program  
The Commission is continuing its internship program for current U.S. grantees. We hope that the opportunity of an internship with a German company appeals to you. Depending on your application and background we will approach interested companies and our "Association of Friends and Sponsors of the Fulbright Program". If you are interested, please return the attached application as soon as possible but no later than November 13, 2009.
- 2) European Union Seminar
